About the University

Indira Gandhi University Meerpur was established as a State Government University on September 07, 2013, under Haryana Government Act 29 of 2013. Before coming into existence as an independent State University, it was Post Graduate Regional Centre of Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak since October 03, 1988.

The University is committed to work vigorously for the all-around personality development of students by making them not just outstanding professionals and entrepreneurs but also good individuals with ingrained human values. The University Campus is situated in village Meerpur at a distance of 10 km from the district headquarters of Rewari, about 340 km from Chandigarh, the State Capital and 70 km from Indira Gandhi International Airport, New Delhi. It is well connected by railways and roadways as well.

The University Library named after the former Prime Minister of India, Bharat Ratan Sh. Atal Bihari Vajpayee is strategically located, with excellent state-of-the-art computer facilities and a stress-free environment. It provides digital facilities to the students. The library system, besides being elegant, provides support for academic and research pursuits. It has a rich collection of knowledge resources i.e. books and journals. Using Library Software "Koha" the library has created a complete database of books purchased. The university has signed MoU with INFLIBNET to access the resources on Shodhganga/Shodhgangotri for academic and research purposes. The books can be searched on the university website. Electronic books and Electronic journals are accessible on DELNET. The Library has a Reading Hall to provide the students with an uninterrupted reading environment and recently inaugurated by the Prof. S.K.Gakhar, Vice Chancellor of IGU Meerpur.

Laboratories

Spacious laboratories with modular fixtures, fittings and technical design are installed in the University. The University is equipped with laboratories of all science subjects. The Laboratories have all kinds of high ended equipments and instruments to provide students in doing practicals. The Department of Geography in its Laboratory is equipped with the latest Geographical software such as ArcGIS, Envi and Esri needed by the students for their curricula as well as research.

Directorate of Sports

The university players have shown their talents in the form of remarkable performance in sports on almost all the occasions and opportunities. To harness the potential of the youth and promoting sports in the University, the creation of excellent infrastructure including two ultra-modern Gymnasium Halls for all indoor activities is available for the benefit of students and staff. The Directorate organizes various inter-departmental and inter-college tournaments for men and women players and coaching camps for students. It also deputes the teams for participation in inter-university tournaments and national games. In past years, IGU Meerpur has won one Silver Medal (Shot-Put) in All India Inter-University Athletics Championship, two Bronze medals in all India Inter University Judo Championship, One Bronze Medal in All India Inter-University Qwan-ki-do Championship Sports Achievement at Khelo India University Games and three Bronze medals in Khelo India University Games.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is inspired by the vision of transformational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge institutions to help build the architecture of an Inclusive India. The Mission of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is to enable higher educational institutions to work with the people of rural India in identifying development challenges and evolving appropriate solutions for accelerating sustainable growth. Under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur has adopted 11 Villages namely Janti, Budana, Budani, Sunaria, Khatawali, Meerpur, Tatarpur, Turkiawas, Gokalpur, JatSairwas and MajraSheoraj and involves in various social development activities.

Atmanirbhar Haryana

'Atmanirbhar' is a Hindi phrase that means 'Self Reliant'. The programme is focused on making Haryana self-sufficient in providing employment opportunities as well as in facing the challenges like COVID-19 Pandemic in an efficient manner. The programme is motivated by the 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' Programme which is being run by the Central Government of India. In this context, the term is used as an umbrella concept about making India a bigger and more important part of the global economy. Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur is committed to contribute towards 'Atmanirbhar Haryana' programme wholeheartedly.

Learning Management System (L.M.S.)

COVID-19 pandemic outbreak imposed sudden lockdown throughout the country due to which all the classes of various programmes were shifted to online mode. The students interacted with teachers through various methods of online mode. The University transformed this challenge into an opportunity and decided to develop a platform for imparting education and managing online classes. A platform where students can interact with their faculty members, get course handouts, study materials etc. easily, upload their assignments, practical and project work, etc. and appear for assessment and evaluations at a single place and maintain proper record of all these tasks. The basic purpose was to make the classroom online. To fulfil all these emergent needs, Indira Gandhi University has developed a Learning Management System (L.M.S.) where all the lectures notes/study materials were uploaded by the concerned teachers and the students not only attended the online classes but also accessed the stored lectures, lectures notes/study materials as and when required. Besides this, all kinds of Assignments/Projects were also assigned to the students through L.M.S. and submissions are made on the same and the attendance record of the students was maintained effectively.

Revision and Updation of Curriculum

1. Choice Based Credit System: The University has introduced the Choice Based Credit System at Post Graduate level w.e.f. academic session 2016-17 for evaluation of student's continuous performance during the programme and in the term examinations. The Choice Based Credit System is the process of continuous evaluation of a student's performance which allows flexibility to the students to progress at an optimum pace suited to their ability and convenience, subject to fulfilling minimum requirements for continuation. The scheme and syllabi have been revised as per the guidelines provided by UGC regarding the Choice Based Credit

System. To inculcate values and ethics in the students, the University has launched Value Education as a Foundation Course under CBCS System.

- 2. **Comprehensive Revision of the Syllabus** During the sessions 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22, Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur has restructured the syllabi of all programmes/courses being run in various University Teaching Departments.
- 3. Communication Skills and Personality Development as Foundation Course- This course was launched during the session 2019-20 with the objective to enhance communication skills combined with personality development.
- 4. Inclusion of Self-study, Seminar, Computer applications, Quantitative Techniques and Statistics as compulsory component of the Syllabi.

Self-Study -The objective of this course is to create habits of reading books and other study materials and to develop writing skills so as to enhance creativity and originality. After selecting a suitable title for the paper in consultation with the teacher, the student will be required to prepare a hand-written report of about 6-10 pages in his/her handwriting. It is mandatory to submit the revised report after evaluation. Thus, this paper provides ample opportunities for students to learn.

Seminar-Students are required to prepare a presentation on any topic, apart from the syllabus, assigned by the teacher concerned in the department on the theme/topic such as review of research papers/articles published in national and international journals or any other research-based paper in his/her area of interest. The way of presentation, relevancy & depth of subject matter of the topic and answers to the questions are some innovative parameters of the evaluation.

Computer Applications -To make every student well versed in modern-day Information Technology, this course was launched during the session 2019-20. In this course, students shall acquire the knowledge of basic and advanced uses of computers and apply these in their academics.

Quantitative Techniques and Data Analytics- Data science is one of the emerging fields of knowledge and its relevance has been increasing day by day. Keeping in view these trends, IGU has made this course compulsory for all students so that they can learn new skills and enhance their knowledge.

Inclusion of Current Affairs in Commerce, Economics and Management- The University has launched these innovative courses in the Departments of Commerce, Economics & Management. Students shall acquaint themselves with the knowledge of current affairs in this field of study.

Examination Reforms

The Examination Branch of Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur devised robust mechanisms for efficient deliveries to the satisfaction of all stakeholders. Around 75000 (Seventy-Five Thousand) DMCs were printed and issued to the students in the last year. On the request of the students, the most desired examination reform is the re-appear exam of all penultimate semesters and B.Ed. be held with the final sem. every six months, found the nod of approval from Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur authorities and the Academic Council. This has been a long-standing demand and shall attend to the larger benefit of students. The time of online application for revaluation was reduced to 15 days from 30 days so that the revaluation results are declared in time.

From the academic session 2020-21, to address the queries of the students, an "Online" student portal has been created with:

- a) Online filling of application forms for revaluation, reappear and improvement with automatic generation of admit cards for reappearing and improvement cases.
- b) A facility where the registration and examination form shall be displayed on the student portal, after the concerned college fills the online form.
- c) "SMS Alert" has been provided to each enrolled student for all required information.

- d) Online ticket-based help desk has been provided to each enrolled student for their queries.
- e) An option has been provided to all the affiliated colleges to submit online RR/CR and examination fees for all regular students.

The Examination Branch of the University is fully automated and all the work related to examinations i.e. seeking examination forms from students, collecting examination fees, conducting examinations, the printing of mark sheets and degrees is being handled by Examination Branch in-house only. As a unique move, the university appointed Dean Examinations Affairs to handle the examination related issues more efficiently. To ensure data security and secrecy, a new mechanism has been worked out viz. any change made in the database of students shall be automatically reflected on the personal e-mail of the Controller of Examinations by midnight (Zero hours) every day.

Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur has started a drive to make the campus green and with this objective, plants of different varieties are planted every year. More than 5000 plants of fruits, herbal and medicinal value etc. are being planted on regular basis.

MoUs with Other Institutions

MoU with Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas: To promote the vast scientific, ancient and Indian Knowledge, Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Shikhsa Sanskriti Utthan Nyas on July 16, 2019, for starting a certificate course.

MoU with Central Public Works Department: An MoU was signed between Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur, Rewari and Central Public Works Department on September 05, 2019. The agreement will accelerate the construction of various university blocks.

An MoU was signed between Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur and Shri Krishna Ayush University, Kurukshetra on October 06, 2020 to increase research participation between two Universities. Both Universities will jointly participate in research projects, conference, seminars, academic interactive sessions and professional. Through this, we will work towards making the scientific approach of Ayurvedic medicines authentic. With this MoU, the two Universities will also exchange mutual facilities, labraries, internet facilities, academic activities and research facilities as well as laboratory facilities for research in various departments such as chemistry, botany, pharmaceutical sciences and biotechnology.

MoU with INFLIBNET: The University entered into an MoU with INFLIBNET for Shodhganga and Shodhgangotri on July 05, 2021. The agreement will promote research in the university.

MoU with Mental health Action by People (MAP): An MoU was signed between Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur and Mental health Action by People (MAP), Kerla on August 04, 2021 which will enable both the institutions to start post graduate certificate course in School Counseling. Both the organization will offer/guidance and counseling to people suffering from mental ailments/deficiencies. The 6 months Certificate Course will develop in students the skill to tackle the mental/psychological issues of the people.

Initiatives taken during the COVID-19 Pandemic

To prevent the spread of COVID-19 in India, Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi announced a massive lockdown in India from March 24, 2020. During this period, Indira Gandhi University, while realizing its social responsibility, has shown continuous enthusiasm towards fulfilling them. A brief description of the various steps taken by the university to fulfil its social responsibility is as follows:

Sanitization Work and Awareness Campaign: All buildings of the university campus were sanitized several times during the lockdown period. The university has been making various efforts at its level to make people aware to comply to the call of sanitization, follow social distancing and wear face masks. University has conducted awareness campaigns through various mediums like NSS and YRC volunteers and university website, etc.

MCQs for UGC NET Exam Preparation: With a view that the students could use the lockdown period for preparing UGC NET Examinations, the teachers of some departments prepared and compiled objective questions according to the syllabus of UGC NET and all these questions were also uploaded on the university's website so that students could be benefitted.

Psychological counselling to keep the students stress-free: Psychological counselling services were started by the Department of Psychology to keep the university students stress-free. For this, a portal called 'Vivechna' was launched on the university website where the student could get the solutions for their problems. Many students used the services of this portal for getting counseling for their problems.

COVID-19 Relief Fund: A portal for COVID Relief Fund was launched on the university website to help the government in fighting the pandemic. In this, all the teaching and non-teaching employees of the university contributed their one day salary for two consecutive months. Apart from this, many teachers voluntarily made additional contributions to this fund. Many students and alumni also contributed as much as possible. With this initiative, the university has collected Rs.13,18,201/- which were transferred to "CM Haryana COVID-19 Relief Fund".

COVID Care Centre: The University was also recognised as 'COVID Care Centre' by the District Administration and to fulfil our responsibility towards society the university administration gleefully accepted the same. Maharana Pratap Boys' Hostel and Rani Laxmi Bai Girls' Hostel were converted into COVID Care Centres during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The University was also awarded an appreciation letter by the District administration for its contribution and distinguished services during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Masks and Sanitizers distribution: The Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) is a program for rural areas being run by the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India. The university started a campaign for providing masks and sanitisers in Meerpur village realizing its role in society through the UBA team. The masks were stitched by women in the village itself and distributed to the needy in rural areas. All masks were sanitized before dispensing. Hand sanitisers were also given to the villagers. After talking to the sarpanch and district administration, the campaign was implemented according to the instructions given by them.

Vice-Chancellor's Meeting with NSS Volunteers: To keep students connected with education and social work during this period and encourage them to learn something new, the university Vice-Chancellor had meetings with NSS volunteers of all four units through online mode. The students also shared their opinions on various related issues.

Quarantine Center Service: Quarantine centre was established in the university campus for 70 students who returned from Kota to Rewari and proper separate arrangements were made for boys and girls.

Meeting regarding examinations with various college principals: The Vice-Chancellor held a meeting with the principals of various colleges associated with Indira Gandhi University to find out a way to the examinations of the current semester. Based on the many suggestions received in the meeting, the date of examinations and Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for the examination were outlined. Vice-Chancellor assured that the final decision will be taken unanimously keeping the interests of the students in mind.

Establishment of COVID-19 Cell and Public Health Management Department: A five-member COVID-19 Cell was set up to give necessary suggestions regarding the smooth running of the University after the lockdown period and was given the responsibility to implement the COVID-19 guidelines issued by the Centre and State government from time-to-time. In the post lockdown period, Public Health Management Department was established to operationalize the guidelines.

The honour of Sanitization workers on the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi: "Safai Karamcharis are the protectors of our health. Just as the border troops protect the country, the sanitary workers are protecting the health of us all" said Prof. S.K. Gakhar on this occasion and all the workers in Rewari district were honoured by providing the sanitization kit.

Directorate of Research and Innovation

Guidelines for removing Discrepancies:

- 1. Regarding admissions in B.Ed./M.Ed. Programme, discrepancies regarding personal details including Category/Sub Category and Educational Qualifications of the candidates will only be entertained upto the date and time mentioned in the admission schedule notified by the University. For this purpose, the concerned candidate shall have to submit proof(s) for the purpose of such correction(s) only. Such discrepancies shall be entertained through the Support/Discrepancy Portal of B.Ed./M.Ed. admission portal available on the University Website. Further, candidates can also make a request to incorporate the marks/result of their respective post graduation if he/she wishes to do so within stipulated time as mentioned in the admission schedule notified by the University.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS AT A GLANCE

- 1. Prospectus containing eligibility conditions, list of participating Colleges/Institutions with number of sanctioned seats, code number of Colleges/Institutes and reservation policy can be seen/downloaded from University website **www.igu.ac.in**.
- 2. Before filling the online Application Form the candidates are required to read the prospectus carefully.
- 3. The Admission to B.Ed./M.Ed.(Regular) Programmes run by the affiliated colleges of education of this University for the session 2021-22 will be made on the basis of inter-se merit of percentage of the Qualifying Examination through online counseling.
- 4. In case a candidate has passed the Master Degree Examination also
 - (a) after Bachelor Degree, the higher percentage of marks obtained either in Under Graduate or Post Graduate degree of the two will be taken into consideration while preparing the merit list for admission to B.Ed. Programme.
 - (b) In case of admission to M.Ed. Programme, merit list will be prepared on the basis of marks obtained in B.Ed. Programme.
- 5. Anyone who is already in employment (whole time or part time or in honorary capacity) shall not be admitted to the B.Ed./M.Ed. (Regular) Programmes in any college of education without taking No Objection Certificate and leave from the employer for full academic session.
- 6. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to ensure eligibility for admission before applying for the course. If on verification at a later stage, it is found that a candidate does not fulfill the eligibility conditions, his/her candidature will be cancelled and the fee deposited by him/her shall be forfeited.
- 7. On-line registration-cum-counseling fee is Rs. 1000/- (Rs. 500/- registration fee plus Rs. 500/- Counseling fee) for General Category candidates and Rs. 625/- (Rs. 125/- registration fee plus Rs. 500/- Counseling fee) for SC/BC/Differently Abled candidates of Haryana state. Registration cum Counseling fee is non-refundable.
- 8. On-line registration-cum-Counseling fee shall be deposited by the candidate through net banking/ debit/ credit card only.
- 9. All the candidates must verify their personal information during online registration.
- 10. Locking of submitted choices is advisable, however, candidates who do not lock the choices, their last filled choice would be considered final.
- 11. Registered candidates who do not fill choices or fail to save the same cannot be considered for admission and seat allotment.
- 12. Candidates must take print-out of their online Application Form along with their locked choices. This print-out has to be signed and submitted at the time of reporting for admission.

- 13. The outcome of different rounds will be displayed on <u>www.igu.ac. in</u> as per admission schedule.
 - No individual allotment letter will be sent to the candidates. They will have to download by applying Registration and password allotted to them and report to the allotted college.
- 14. All the candidates who are allotted seats will report to allotted college/ institute within stipulated date, failing which their seat allotment shall stand cancelled. Also, they will not be considered for further Counseling.
- 15. Candidates will produce all the relevant certificates in original including registration-cumcounseling fee receipt for verification along with provisional allotment letter, a signed print out of their online application form, their locked choices generated from the website at the time of reporting.
- 16. At the time of reporting, if documents are found to be correct on verification by the college then provisional admission/ auto up- gradation letter generated online will be issued to the candidate by the concerned college. The candidate shall check all the entries in this provisional admission/auto up-gradation letter and should sign it and preserve it for further reference.
- 17. The allotment of seats is liable to be cancelled, if the personal data viz. Category, Subcategory, Group (Group-I Science & Arts with Maths, Group-II Arts & Commerce) residential status (Bonafide Residents of Haryana or All India Category), percentage of marks in qualifying examination, gender etc. submitted by the candidates at the time of registration is found to be wrong at the time of verification of the original certificates at Allotted Institutes. But, if the candidate is found to be eligible after the correction in personal data, the candidate may be considered for subsequent rounds of counseling, if any, against the vacancies only.
- 18. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him/ her, which is found to be incorrect or false at any stage then his/ her admission shall be cancelled and all fees and other dues paid by him/ her shall be forfeited. The University/ College/ Institute may take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate in accordance with law.
- 19. Candidate seeking admission in self financing institutions are advised to ensure that they are lawfully admitted failing which, they shall not be authenticated by the University, and they themselves shall be responsible for any such lapse.
- 20. All the rules and regulations for the submission of migration certificates by the candidates who have passed the qualifying examinations from other Universities will be applicable as per the rules of the University.
- 21. In case, a candidate after having deposited required fee for admission to B.Ed. (Regular) Programme 2021-22 decides to leave the B.Ed. Programme before the last round of counseling, the fee deposited by the candidate will be refundable to him/her by the concerned college if the seat so vacated is filled by some other candidate after deducting Rs. 1000/- only. The same rule applicable for admission to M.Ed. Programme.
- 22. In case of ambiguity about any rule, the interpretation of the same by the University shall be final.

- 23. All legal disputes relating to admission to B.Ed./M.Ed. (Regular) Programme will be subject to Courts having jurisdiction at Rewari.
- 24. The number of colleges/sanctioned seats may increase or decrease based upon the approval of apex body and affiliation from the University.
- 25. Candidates are advised to consult the updated list of colleges on the websites **www.igu.ac.in** before filling their choice as intake in various institutes subject to change by the competent authority in view of pending writs\appeals in courts\NCTE with regard to their recognition.
- 26. The Attendance rules of the University will be applicable on the admitted students as per ordinance of the B.Ed./M.Ed. regular programme.
- 27. The participating colleges/Institutions will ensure that all the admissions will be made only on the basis of the recognized and valid degree (s)/certificate (s) issued by the approved and recognized boards/Institutes/ Universities. In case any clarification of equivalence/recognition of qualifying degree/certificate/Institute/Board/University is required, the same may be obtained from the affiliating university concerned.
- 28. All the updated latest information/notices/changes/modifications will be displayed on the website. The candidates are required to visit the website regularly to obtain the latest information.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COLLEGES

- 1 Every College/Department shall constitute an Admission Committee to be appointed by the Principal/Chairperson from amongst the teachers of College/Department.
- 2. Verification of the documents of the candidate will be done by the respective Admission Committee of College/Department at the time of reporting for admission, by comparing with the original certificates against which candidate has been allotted seat. Any entry or information filled/ made by the candidate, if found to be false, shall entail automatic cancellation of admission.
- 3. The admission committee may ensure that the Candidate has deposited the fee as per his / her entitlement.
- 4. Online reporting should be done as and when candidate reports at institute and not on the last date of admission.
- 5. After successful admission of the candidate, the institute must issue system generated provisional admission slip/ auto up-gradation letter to candidate.
- 6. Colleges are required to update admission status online on **www.igu.ac.in** strictly as per admission schedule so that the subsequent counseling may be conducted as per schedule, failing which they will be fined heavily.
- 7.Information about only those candidates, whose admission status has seen reported online, will be forwarded to Registration Branch of University.
- 8. Responsibility for any wrong/irregular/excess admission will entirely rest upon the Principal/Chairperson concerned. The Principal/Director of the College/Institute shall not make admission over and above the sanctioned intake. Such admissions shall not be regularised by the University. Registration Branch of this University will ensure that admissions are not made over and above the sanctioned seats by any College/ Institute. If any violation in this regard comes to the notice, the same will be brought to the notice of the University authorities.
- 9. The total number of seats in the erring College(s)/Institute(s) committing any type of irregularity in making admissions etc. will be reduced by minimum ten seats initially for a period of one year and the reduction will be doubled in case the College/Institute repeats the violation of rules.
- 10. Admission of candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from other university shall be provisional subject to verification of the eligibility by the Registration Branch of the university concerned.
- 11. A11 the rules and regulations for submission of Registration Return of students by the college will be applicable as per the rules of the University.
- 12. Every College must give accurate information on its website regarding human and instructional resources alongwith subjects in which teachers are available in the College.

- 13.Under no circumstances the original certificates of the candidate should be retained by the college. The candidate seeking admission will submit two sets of his/ her documents/ certificates duly self attested by Candidate, at the time of reporting in the college. The Principal of the college will authenticate these documents/ certificates after comparing these from the originals and the originals will be returned to the candidate. One set of these documents/ certificates thus authenticated by the college shall be deposited in the affiliating University, for the purpose of registration, for which no original certificates shall be demanded. Anyhow, if the affiliating University, so desires the original certificates from the candidate can be demanded through the institute of his/ her admission for any purpose what so ever these may be.
- 14. For Practical Examinations, Remuneration to the External Examiners, shall be paid by the concerned College as per the norms of Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur-Rewari. Such bills are not required to be submitted to IGU for reimbursement as the expenditure of the same shall be born by the concerned College.

ELIGIBLITY CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION TO B.Ed. TWO YEAR PROGRAMME

Eligibility Conditions for Admission to B.Ed. Two Year Regular Course as per NCTE Norms is as under:

Candidates with at least 50% (47.5% in case of SC/ST/Blind/Visually/Hearing Impaired and Differently Abled Candidates of Haryana only) marks either in the Bachelor's Degree and/or in the Master's Degree in Sciences/Social Sciences/Humanity, Bachelor's in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks (52.25% in case of SC/ST/Blind/Visually/Hearing Impaired and Differently Abled Candidates of Haryana only) or any other qualification equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission to the programme.

Note:

- (i) There shall be no rounding off of percentage of marks of the qualifying examination from 0.5% and above to next higher number for determining the eligibility i.e. 49.5% and above will not be rounded off to 50%.
- (ii) In case a candidate has passed the Master Degree Examination also after Bachelor Degree, the higher percentage of marks obtained in either of the two will be taken into consideration while preparing the merit
- (iii) Candidates with re-appear(s) in the qualifying exam will not be allowed admission in B.Ed./M.Ed. (Regular) Programme in any case.
- (iv) Cut off date for eligibility will be the last date/time of online choice filling.
- (v) One year PG diploma in any subject will not be considered equivalent to Master's Degree.
- (vi) No applicant shall be permitted to pursue two regular degree programs simultaneously.

PREPARATION OF MERIT LIST FOR ADMISSION TO B.Ed. PROGRAMME

Merit for admission to B.Ed. (Regular) Programme shall be determined on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination. In case a candidate has passed the Master's Degree Examination also along with Bachelor's Degree, the higher percentage of marks obtained either in Under Graduate or Post Graduate degree will be taken into consideration while determining the merit. However, if two or more candidates have obtained equal marks, following procedure will be used for the preparation of merit.

- (i) Candidate senior in age will be given first preference
- (ii) If tie still persists, then marks obtained in 12th will be considered
- (iii) If tie still persists, then marks in 10th will be considered to break the tie

DIVISION OF SEATS

50% of the total seats in each college shall be reserved for Group-I i.e. Science & Arts with Mathsgroup candidates. Other 50% seats shall be reserved for Group-II i.e. Arts & Commerce Group Candidates.

Note:

(A) For Govt./Govt. Aided Colleges

- (i) The seats which remain vacant in Group-I i.e. Science &Arts with Maths-group can be converted in Group-II i.e. Arts & Commerce Group and vice-versa in the 2nd round/counseling of Phase-I.Such vacant seats of one group will be converted into same category (General or Reserved) of the other group.
- (ii) If the seats still remain vacant in the same gourp, the same will be converted into General Category in 3rd round/counseling of Phase-I.
- (iii) The vacant seats of SC Categories in Govt./Govt. Aided Colleges of Education will not be converted into General Category.
- (B) For SFS Colleges

The seats which remain vacant in Group-I i.e. Science &Arts with Maths-group can be converted in Group-II i.e. Arts & Commerce Group and vice-versa in the 3rd round/counseling of Phase-I. Such vacant seats of one group will be converted into same category (Haryana Open General Category or All India General Category) of the other group.

Eligibility Conditions for admission to M.Ed. Two years regular programme as per NCTE Norms as under:

- 1. A person who has passed one of the following examinations shall be eligible for admission to M.Ed. programme.
 - (a) B.Ed. examination from any recognized University, obtaining not less than 50% marks in the aggregate.
 - (b) Any other examination recognized by this University as equivalent to (a) above with not less than 50% marks in the aggregate.

PREPARATION OF MERIT LIST FOR ADMISSION TO M.Ed. PROGRAMME

Merit for admission to M.Ed. programme shall be determined on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination. However, if two or more candidates have obtained equal marks, following procedure will be used for the preparation of merit.

- (i) Candidate with higher percentage of marks obtained in under-graduate program will be taken into consideration.
- (ii) Candidate senior in age will be given first preference
- (iii) It tie still persists, then marks obtained in 12th will be considered.
- (iv) It tie still persists, then marks in 10th will be considered to break the tie

In the event of quota reserved for Persons with Differently Abled remain unutilized due to non availability for suitable category of Persons with Differently Abled, it may be offered to the Exservicemen and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).

Further, 3% Horizontal reservation is also provided to Ex-servicemen/Freedom Fighters and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of general category, 1% out of Scheduled Castes and 1% from backward classes category for admissions to the various educational institutions of the Government and Government aided institutes Located in Haryana. As far as block allocation in Block A and Block B of Backward Classes category each concerned year wise, rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block A of Backward Classes are given seats in the Academic year 2018, the next Block i.e. B Block of category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2019 and so on. The Head of the Department concerned shall maintain the record for the purpose.

Fifty percent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived Scheduled Castes as enumerated in the Appendix-JA

Where a seat is set aside for candidate from the deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government Educational Institution is not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidate of the deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualification, the same shall be made available to the candidate of Schedule Castes.

Note: A roaster for reservation of Ex-Serviceman/Freedom Fighter be maintained and carry forward all fractions till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the years. As and when the total comes one, a seat will be provided in the prospectus. (Chief Secretary to Govt. Haryana Letter No. 23/27/2004-2 GS III dated 5.12.2008).

Admission Criteria for EWSs derived from the Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 as under:

- (a) Income & Assets Certificate issuing Authority:
- (i) The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Competent Authority for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be Tehsildar of the area where the applicant normally resides.
- (ii) As per instructions given in Govt. of Haryana General Administration Dept. (G-III Branch) Notification No.22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 13.03.2019, Verifying Authorities for issue of EWS Certificate shall be same as prescribed for issue of resident/income certificates as specified in instruction No. 22/28/2003-3GS-III, dated 30.01.2004.
- (iii) The prescribed format for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be provided at Appendix-CA.
- (b) Criteria of Income & Assets:

- (i) Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled Caste, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) and whose family has gross annual income below Rs.6.00 lakh (Rupees six lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation, Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.
- (ii) Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:
 - a) 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
 - b) Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
 - c) Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
 - d)Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities;
 - e)Total immovable assets owned are valued at Rs. One Crore or more.
- (iii) The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
- (iv) The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who applies for benefit of reservation, his/her parents, spouse as well as children and siblings below the age of 18 years.

Note: For any other clarification, Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS-IH dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 will be referred.

Criteria for EWS in All India Category seats:

The reservation @ 10% to Economically Weaker Sections in All India ategory seats (i.e. 15% of sanctioned intake) under Centre Govt. policy would be in addition to the existing reservation. Admission Criteria for EWSs derived from the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions Department of Personnel & Training, Government of India Notification No.36039/1/2019-Estt (Res) dated 31.01.2019 and the Director General Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula vide their letter No.40395 DHE-190005/97/2020-UNP (STATE)-DHE dated 19.04.2021.

Criteria of Income & Assets:

 Persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs and OBCs and whose family has gross annual income below Rs.8.00 lakh (Rupees eight lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.

Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assetsshall be

excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income :-

- 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
- Residential fiat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
- Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
- Residential plot of 200sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
- The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

Income and Asset Certificate Issuing Authority (Appendix – P):

The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Income and Asset Certificate issued by any one of the following authorities shall only be accepted as proof of candidate's claim as belonging to EWS:

- District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/ Additional Deputy Commissioner/1st Class Stipendary Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner
- Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and
- Sub-Divisional Officer or the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.

Regarding prescribing minimum eligibility qualification for the various

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your kind attention towards Government instructions No. 3870-WGI-ASOII-64/20069 dated 6th/9th October, 1964 whereby the candidates of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes provided 5% reduction in marks in the minimum eligibility qualification for admissions in various courses.

It has come to the notice of the Government that at present where a General Category candidate is required to have 50% marks in a prescribed qualification for admission in any course, as per the above instructions a reserve category candidate is required to have 45% marks giving him 5% reduction in the minimum qualification. Vide judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No. 7084/2011, it has been observed that the practice is wrong and the relaxation of 5% should be reduced from the minimum required marks on a general category candidate for e.g.:-

In a course, a general candidate requires to have 50% marks, than as per Govt. instructions by giving 5% relaxation the minimum eligibility marks for a reserved caste candidate should be calculated as under:-

Out of 100 Marks needs to less = 5

Out of 1 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100

Out of 50 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100 X 50 =2.50

This way minimum less marks where general category candidates are required to have 50% in a prescribed qualification, the total required marks for a reserved candidates will be 50 - 2.50 = 47.50 and not 45.

All concerned are requested to implement the instructions as per the above procedure in the compliance of the judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in CWP No. 7084/2011.

GUIDELINES FOR RESERVATION

- 1. The Reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of the Haryana Govt. and is subject to any change/amendment made by the State Govt. from time to time.
- 2. Candidates belonging to SC/ST/EWS are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-C**, **CA** and **P**. The list of Schedule Castes notified by the Haryana Government is available at **Appendix-J** and **Appendix-JA**.
- 3. Candidate belonging to Backward Classes are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-D**. The list of Backward Classes in Haryana notified by the Haryana Government is available at **Appendix-H**. Circular no. 1170-SW(1)-95 dated 07.06.95 of the Haryana Government for excluding Socially Advanced Persons/Sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes may be referred to **Appendix-I**.
- **4.** The children or grand children (Maternal & Paternal) of Freedom Fighters are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-E**.
- 5. Only those candidates having a permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the programme) will be considered for admission as Differently Abled. They will have to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per Appendix-G. Disability Certificate shall, however, be subject to verification by a Medical Board to be constituted by the university for the purpose. The decision of the Medical Board in this regard shall be final.
- 6. Children or Wards of Military Personnel (including personnel of Para-Military Forces killed in Action or Permanently Disabled in Action and Boarded out from the Services or Ex-Servicemen and their wards will be considered for reservation. They will submit a certificate as per Appendix-F. The following categories of personnel of Territorial Army are included in the definition of Ex-Servicemen in terms of the State Govt. letter No. 12/18/2006-GS-II dated 08-01-2008:
 - (i) Pensions holders for continuous embodied service
 - (ii) Persons with disability attributable to military service
 - (iii) Gallantry Award Winners and
 - (iv) Such recruits boarded out/released on medical grounds and granted medical/disability pension.
- 7. A candidate who applies for a reserved category or for both, reserved and general categories, will be considered first in general category. In case, he is not selected in general category, he will be considered for reserved category.

The Schedules Castes/Backward Classes candidates who get selected/admitted in Educational/Professional/Technical Institutions and Universities in open competition on the basis of their own merit, will not be counted against the quota reserved for schedules caste/backward classes, rather they will be treated as open competition candidates. However, such candidates shall fulfill condition of eligibility regarding age etc. as are meant for general category candidates (Memo No. 13864-75 dated 24.8.2012 received from the Principal Secretary to Govt. of Haryana Welfare of Schedule Caste and Backward Classes, Department, Chandigarh).

- **8.** If a candidate belongs to more than one reserved category, he/she shall be required to give his/her preference at the time of filling up the admission form. Preference once given shall not be changed.
- **9.** If a candidate of Haryana Open, SC and BC category also apply for Persons with Differently Abled/ESM/DFF category will be considered first for Haryana Open, SC and BC category.
- **10.** If the reserved seat(s) of BC Block-A remain vacant, these will be filled up from BC Block-B and vice-versa.
- 11. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of SC, the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other category. For example, if any seat in SC category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from Deprived SC category and vice-versa.
- 12. Benefit of reservation will be given to all the reserved categories up to 3rd counseling according to the reservation policy given in the Prospectus. In case at the time of 3rd counseling, the reserved seats of various categories other than SC category, remain vacant and no eligible candidates of the reserved categories are available, these vacant seats may be thrown open to Haryana General Category. In case, the seats in Haryana Open General Category remain vacant open at the end, the same will be thrown open to All India Open Category.
- **13.** For the horizontal reservation, candidates of Haryana Open, SC and BC categories will also have to furnish ESM/DFF certificate.
- 14. Reservation policy is not applicable on Private Educational "Institutions (SELF FINANCING SCHEME Colleges) which receive no aid from the State irrespective of the mode of Examination i.e. either by themselves or by Nodal Authority vide Memo No. 18/170-07 UNP(4) dated 27.8.2007 from Commissioner and Secretary to Government Haryana, Education Department, Chandigarh.
- 15. A person belonging to the General Category married to a person belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Backward Classes, he/ she shall not be entitled to the benefit of reservation vide.

 Letter No. 22/57/20073GS-III dated 6/9/2007 from the Chief Secretary to Govt., Haryana.

ONLINE ADMISSION PROCEDURE

This section provides an overview of the steps involved in counseling and admission process.

A. Online Registration

- 1. Candidate should visit website www.igu.ac.in.
- 2. Candidates should go through prospectus for gathering information/instruction in details about counseling schedules and procedures. Softcopy is available on the websites www.igu.ac.in
- 3. For Phase-I and Phase-II candidates will register themselves as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule for Govt./Govt. Aided/ Self Finance Colleges of Education in Haryana.
- 4. For participation in online admission process, a candidate has to register by submitting personal data/requisite information correctly in the online application form. On submitting this data/ information user Id and password will be generated/ created for use in future logins by the candidate.
- 5. For subsequent logins, candidates will be able to login directly with their user Id and password. Candidates should remember to logout at the end of their session so that the details filled by them cannot be tampered with or modified by unauthorized person.
- **6.** Candidates are advised to record/remember their password for future logins and not to disclose or share their password with anybody.
- 7. It is solely the responsibility of the candidates to verify that their personal data including Category, Subcategory, Group (Science/Arts with Maths & Art/Commerce), Residential Status, gender etc are consistent with documentary evidence.
- 8. If the personal data submitted /entered by the candidates are found to be wrong at the time verification of certificate either during reporting or at a later stage, the allotment of seat/provisional admission is liable to be cancelled.
- 9. Candidates should take a print out (hard copy) of the online application form containing the above personal data for future use.

B. Payment of Registration & Counseling Fee.

- 1 Fee can be deposited through Net banking/Credit/Debit card only.
- 2 Last date for payment of Registration-cum- counseling fee for Phase-I and Phase-II, (for Govt./Govt. Aided/SFS) is as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule.
- 3 Remember you have paid your registration-cum-counseling fee before proceeding for online counseling, otherwise your allotted seat can be CANCELLED at any stage and candidate would not have any claim on such allotted seat.

C. Online Choice Filling & Locking

- 1 For phase-I and phase-II online choice filling & locking by the candidate can be done as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule for Govt./Govt.Aided/Self-Financing Colleges of Education.
- 2 Candidates are advised to go through the updated list of Colleges of Education of Rewari/Mahindergarh District on the website **www.igu.ac.in** and should prepare a list of Colleges in order of preference in which they are interested in seeking admission.
- 3 Candidates can fill maximum 10 (Ten numbers) of choices (in case of SFS Colleges) in order of preference as they wish to.
- 4 Candidates are allowed to change or re-order their choices, delete earlier choices and add new choices any number of times until they lock their final choices.
- 5 All the candidates must lock their final choices as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule.
- 6 Candidates will not be able to unlock their choices once they are locked.

- 7 If candidate fail to explicitly lock their choices by the last date, their last saved choices will be automatically locked and allotment will be done on this basis.
- 8 Candidate must take a print out of their locked choices. This print out has to be signed and submitted at the time of reporting for admission.
- 9 Registered candidates who do not fill choices or fail to save the same cannot be considered for admission and seat allotment.

- 6 The allotment of their seats is liable to be cancelled, if the personal data viz. Category, Subcategory, Group (Group-I Science & Arts with Maths Group-II Arts & Commerce) residential status (Bonafide Residents of Haryana or All India Category), percentage of marks in qualifying examination, gender etc. submitted by the candidates at the time of registration

- is found to be wrong at time of verification of the original certificates at allotted Institutes, But, if the candidate is found to be eligible after the correction in personal data, the candidate may be considered for subsequent rounds of counseling, if any, against the vacancies only.

Subject: Bonafide Residents of Haryana – Guidelines

Sir.

I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institutions (including technical/medical institutions). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgement delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pardeep Jain Vs Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of word 'Domicile', the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government, and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate:-

- i) Candidates who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana;
- ii) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of:
 - a) the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or Working on deputation; of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/Corporations established by or under an
 - b) Act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana;
 - c) The regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government.
- iii) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of persons who, after retirement, have permanently settled in Haryana, and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the state of Haryana.
- iv) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of pensioners of Haryana Govt., irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
- v) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of persons who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period

- of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
- vi) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
- vii) Children/wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognized by Govt. of Haryana (added vide C.S. letter No. 62/27/2003-6 GSI dated 29/7/2003)
- viii) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; further provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are: a) citizens of India; b) produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants have not obtained the benefit of domicile in any other State.
- 2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub Divisional Officer (Civil), Tehsildar (Revenue Department of the District/Sub Division to which the candidates belong). Resident Certificate in respect of the children/wards/dependants of Haryana Government employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of the children/wards/dependants of the employees of the statutory bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana and located at Chandigarh, in Haryana or outside Haryana, should be issued by their respective Heads of Departments.
- 3. Candidates, seeking admission in educational institutions (including Medical and Technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Head Master from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Head Master of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate which should be sufficient.
- 4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana, but at any subsequent time, it is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, and all fees and other dues paid upto the date of such removal shall be confiscated. Principal/Head Master may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians, as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
- 5. These instructions may kindly be noted carefully for compliance.
- **Note:** 1.The State Government, vide letter no. 22/28/2003-3GS-III dated 30.1.2004, has decided that henceforth Circle Revenue Officers (Tehsildar/Naib Tehsildar-cum-Executive Magistrate) concerned has been authorized to issue Resident as well as Caste Certificates (SC/BC/OBC). In case of Haryana Govt. employees serving in

the offices located at Chandigarh/Panchkula and residing at Chandigarh/Panchkula, the Resident Certificate and Caste Certificates to SC/BC employees and their children will be issued by their respective. Heads of the Departments. The proforma for these certificates have also been prescribed by the State Govt. (Appendix-A-I, B &C). Therefore, all the candidates will be required to submit such certificates in the prescribed proforma. The certificate issued by anyone other than the competent authority in the proforma other than the prescribed proforma will not be accepted.

2.Haryana Resident Certificate should be of the date of 30.01.2004 or after. Certificates issued before this date will not be accepted. The candidates must ensure that they get Haryana Resident Certificates and not Haryana Domicile Certificate from the appropriate authority as Haryana Domicile Certificate is invalid for the purpose of admission.

It is clarified that the income from salary will not be taken into account for the purpose of income/wealth tax in respect of service category and while calculating income or wealth tax of the Government employee of Backward Classes who is not covered under Annexure-A, description of categories No. I, II (a,b,c,d) and III & IV, hence becoming entitled for the benefit of reservation under Backward Classes category, his salary should not be included but his other sources of income/wealth be included for income/wealth tax. All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Head of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

Sub: Exclusion of socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that following the Supreme Court judgement in the Indira Sawhney and others versus Union of India case, the Haryana Government vide notification dated 12.10.1993 had set up the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission. The terms of reference of this Commission were to entertain, examine and recommend upon requests for inclusion and complaints of over-inclusion and under-inclusion in the list of Backward Classes. Vide notification dated 26-05-1994, the Commission was also assigned the function of specifying the basis, applying the relevant and requisite socio-economic criteria to exclude socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

In its report submitted on 16.05.1995, the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission had recommended the criteria for excluding socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes. After considering these recommendations, the Government has decided that the benefit of reservation shall not apply to persons/sections mentioned in **Annexure** '!', which is enclosed.

All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Heads of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

- d) Parents of whom the husband is Class-I Officer (direct recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the

- wife is a Class-II officer and the wife dies or suffers permanent incapacitation; and
- e) Parents, of whom the wife is a Class-I Officer (Direct Recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the husband is a Class-II officer & the husband dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.

The criteria enumerated in A&B above in this Category will apply mutatis mutandi to officers holding equivalent or comparable posts in PSUs, Banks, Insurance Organizations, Universities, etc. pending the evaluation of the posts on equivalent or comparable basis in these institutions, the criteria specified in category V below will apply to the officers in these Institutions. Son(s) and daughter(s) of parents either or both of whom is or are in the rank of Colonel and above in the army and to equivalent posts in the Navy and the Air Force and the Para Military Forces:

Provided that -

- i. If the wife of an Armed Forces Officer is herself in the Armed Forces (i.e. the category under consideration), the rule of exclusion will apply only when she herself has reached the rank of Colonel;
- ii. The service ranks below Colonel of husband and wife shall not be clubbed together;
- iii. If the wife o an officer in the Armed Forces is in Civil employment, this will not be taken into

account for applying the rule o exclusion unless she falls in the service category under item No II in which case the criteria and conditions enumerated therein will apply to her independently.

Son(s) and daughter(s) of persons belonging to a family (father, mother and minor children) which owns land more than land permissible under the Ceiling Act of Haryana State.

Son(s) and daughter(s) of:

- a) Persons having gross annual income of Rs. 4.50 lakhs or above or possessing wealth above the exemption limit as prescribed in the Wealth Tax Act for a period of three consecutive years. (Range of income has been revised from Rs. 2.50 lakhs to Rs. 4.50 lakhs vide Chief Secretary letter No. 22/22/2004-3GS-III dated 22.01.2009).
- b) Persons in Categories I,II, III & IV who are not disentitled to the benefit of reservation but have income from other sources of wealth which will bring them within the income/wealth criteria mentioned in (a) above.

Explanation:

- i. Income from salaries or agricultural land shall not be clubbed.
- ii. The income criteria in terms of rupee will be modified taking into account the change in its value every three years. If the situation, however, so demands, the interregnum may be less.
- iii. Where the husband is in some profession and the wife is in a class II or lower grade employment, the income/wealth test will apply only on the basis of the husband's income.
- iv. If the wife is in any profession and the husband is in employment in a Class II or lower rank post, then the income/wealth criterion will apply only on the basis of the wife's income and the husband's income will not be clubbed with it.
- v. Explanation: Wherever the expression, 'permanent incapacitation' occurs in this schedule it shall mean incapacitation which results in putting an Officer out of service

No. Leg.15/2020. – The following Act of the Legislature of the State of Haryana received the assent of the Governor of Haryana on the 25th March, 2020 and is hereby published for general information:-

HARYANA ACT NO. 14 OF 2020

THE HARYANA SCHEDULED CASTES (RESERVATION IN ADMISSION IN GTOVERNMENT EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS) ACT, 2020

An

ACT

to provide for reservation in admission in Government educational institutions of persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes in the State of Haryana with special measures for deprived Scheduled Castes and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Haryana in the Seventy-first Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

- 1. This Act may be called the Haryana Scheduled Castes (Reservation in admission in Government Educational Institutions Act, 2020.
- 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,-
 - (a) "Annexure" means the Annexure appended to this Act;
 - (b) "competent authority" means an officer appointed under section5;
- (c) "deprived Scheduled Castes" means such Scheduled Castes as specified in Annexure;
 - (d) "Government educational institution" means any higher education institution established and maintained by the Government or receiving aid out of the State funds, imparting education leading to the award of a degree including a

- post-graduate degree and shall include Government aided technical and professional institutions;
- (e) "Government" means the Government of the State of Haryana in the administrative department;
- (f) "prescribed" means prescribed by the rules;
- (g) "Scheduled Castes" means Scheduled Castes notified under article 341 of the Constitution of India.
- 3. (1) Twenty percent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions.
 - (2) Fifty percent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any Government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived Scheduled Castes as enumerated in the Annexure.
- 4. Where a seat set aside for candidate from deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government educational institutions is not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidate of deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualifications, the same shall be made available to candidate of Scheduled Castes.
- 5. (1) The Government may, by notification, appoint any officer as competent authority for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this Act.
 - (2) The competent authority shall, for the purposes of section 3, issue caste identification certificate specifying the caste name of the Scheduled Caste, in such manner, as may be prescribed.
 - (3) The competent authority shall, for the purposes of this Act, exercise such powers and perform such functions, as may be prescribed.
 - (4) The competent authority shall be deemed to be a public servant within the meaning of section 21 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Central Act 45 of 1860).
- 6. A person belonging to the deprived Scheduled Castes shall, for the purposes of section 3, support his candidature by a certificate of caste identification issued by the competent authority under sub-section (2) of section 5.
- 7. No suit, prosecution or other legal proceedings shall lie against the competent authority, officers of the Government for anything which is in good faith done or intended to be done under this Act or any rule or order made thereunder.

8. If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Government may, by order, published in the Official Gazette, make such provisions not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, as may appear to be necessary for removing the difficulty:

Provided that no such order shall be made under this section after the expiry of three years from the commencement of this Act.

- 9. (1) The Government shall, by notification in Official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act.
 - (2) Every rule made under this Act shall, as soon as possible, after it is made, be laid before the State Legislature.
- 10. The Government may, on the basis of such criteria, as may be prescribed and on the expiration of ten years from the coming into force of this Act and at every succeeding period of five years thereafter, review the Scheduled Castes included in the Annexure.
